Meeting of the Cabinet of Ministers of Turkmenistan

President of Turkmenistan Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov chaired a meeting of the Cabinet of Ministers to review the programme of the visit of the Turkmen government delegation led by the President to the Republic of Tajikistan and the important issues of the national policy.

Opening the meeting the Turkmen leader addressed the heartfelt congratulations to women of the country on the coming spring holiday - the International Women's Day traditionally celebrated on March 8 and wished good health, family wellbeing and great happiness to 'the beautiful half' of mankind.

The President signed the Decree "On Conferring the Honorary Title Ene Myakhri" and demanded that the high level of organisation of festive ceremonies and celebrations be ensured.

Then the floor was then given Chief of the Department of State Protocol and International Relations of the President's Office B. Myatiev, who reported on the preparations for the coming visit of the government delegation to the Republic of Tajikistan and the progress in drafting the official bilateral documents to be signed during the visit. Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov said that the ceremony of putting two children's health-improving centres into operation would take place on June 1 in Geokdere and two recreation and entertainment centres in Avaza. The first guests to these centres would be children from the Republic of Haiti, who had suffered from the recent devastating earthquake. Instructing Vice Premiers H. Saparlyev and R. Meredov to undertake all necessary measures the Turkmen leader emphasized that this act of goodwill towards the people of Haiti would be a new vivid illustration of Turkmenistan's adherence to the principles of mutual aid and humanism.

Vice Premier T. Japarov reported on Turkmenistan's social and economic progress in January-February. It was noted that through the progressive reforms implemented under the leadership of President Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov the macroeconomic indicators had increased considerably in the country. Thus, in January the GDP growth was observed in all sectors. In the reporting period the total volume of investments from all sources of financing had risen 2.2 times as compared to the same period of 2009. In January-February the retail turnover had increased to 113.5 percent as compared to the same period of 2009. Reporting on the implementation of the State budget, the Vice Premier noted that a major amount of the budgetary funds had been assigned to the social sphere. The expenditures for these purposes made up 72 percent.

Turkmenistan and United Kingdom enhance energy cooperation

The participants of the Second Turkmen-British Energy Business Forum discussed the priority aspects of mutually advantageous partnership in the fuel and energy sector. The forum was organized by the Ministry of Oil and Gas Industry and Mineral Resources of Turkmenistan and the British Embassy in Turkmenistan with the assistance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. The participants represented the Department of Energy and Climate Change of the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office, the leading British oil and gas and service companies and educational institutions. Turkmenistan was represented by the leaders and experts of the oil and gas departments and enterprises.

This was the second meeting conducted by the Turkish and British businessmen for the past two years that illustrated the British companies' growing willingness to expand cooperation with Turkmenistan, which had won the reputation worldwide as a very promising and dependable partner. The British businessmen noted that the key conditions fostering an interest of the European and British business communities in Turkmenistan included the energy policy initiated by President Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov and known well in the world community as aimed at ensuring reliable and stable transit of energy to world markets and the abundant hydrocarbon reserves.

Noting that the major priorities for the EU countries included energy security and search for new energy corridors to Europe Lord Philip Hunt, Minister of State for the Department of Energy and Climate Change evaluated highly Turkmenistan's efforts to build consistently and successfully diversified system for hydrocarbon exports. "I believe that today's meeting with His Excellency President of Turkmenistan Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov and the well-organized business forum will give new impetus to further cooperation in such a priority for both countries field as the fuel and energy sector," Lord Philip Hunt said.

The high-ranking officials of the Turkmen fuel and energy departments of Turkmenistan briefed the foreign guests on the legal aspects of cooperation with the huge resource potential and the priority trends in development of the oil and gas sector. It was noted that implementing the energy policy initiated by the national leader Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov Turkmenistan resolutely extended the geography of export routes for natural gas. Along with traditional 'blue fuel' exports to Russia Turkmenistan started to supply natural gas to China last December and had significantly increased gas exports to Iran via the second southern pipeline Dovletabad-Saraks-Hangeran.

The Turkmen enterprises take measures to develop further transport infrastructure that allow expanding Turkmenistan's export potential and accelerating the activities to put proven deposits in production. The relevant illustrations include the largest Southern Yoloten-Osman deposit, the huge reserves of which were confirmed by the British Gaffney, Cline & Associates firm. The leading companies from the PRC, UAE and the Republic of Korea are Turkmengaz's partners on the implementation of the first stage of commercial development of this field. To date, total of over 1,000 oil and gas pools have been discovered and over 150 deposits have been explored in the country, one third of them are under development.

The programme of further development of Turkmenistan's oil and gas industry opens up the ample opportunities for international cooperation on oil and gas exploration and production in the Turkmen sector of the Caspian Sea, modernization of existing processing facilities and construction of new ones, development of pipeline infrastructure, application of advanced technologies and state-of-the-art equipment in industry.

The important aspects of cooperation discussed at the Business Forum included expansion of partnership for training highly qualified fuel and energy specialists. The large-scale programmes of modernization and development of Turkmenistan's oil and gas industry require the new approaches to managing vocational training of local specialists in advanced foreign technologies and operation of state-of-the-art equipment.

The forum participants representing the British companies expressed the readiness to implement joint projects, offer their profound expertise and advanced technologies and made investments in these projects. It should be noted that along with the long-time partners of the Turkmen fuel and energy sector including British Petroleum, Shell, Burren Energy, Gaffney, Cline & Associates, a number of the other companies including Denton Wilde Sapte, Skybridge, KBR, Hermes, which sought to operate on the very promising Turkmen market, presented their potential at the Business Forum.

The specific proposals and priority fields of further cooperation were set forth in the protocol of intent, which was signed by the Ministry of Oil and Gas Industry and Mineral Resources of Turkmenistan and the UK Department of Energy and Climate Change upon concluding the Business Forum. The participants expressed belief that the exchange of views aimed at identifying the ways to foster effective cooperation in compliance with the priorities of the policy of the Turkmen state would be a new step to promote energy partnership.

High prestige of Turkmen polypropylene

Over 20,000 tons of granular polypropylene has been loaded from the terminal of the Turkmenbashi international seaport abroad since the beginning of 2010. This product exported under the trade mark Turkmenplen is on the top list of oil products manufactured at the Turkmenbashi oil refineries. It is in extremely high demand on the world markets that is vividly illustrated by numerous contracts concluded for Turkmen propylene at the State Commodity and Raw Materials Exchange of Turkmenistan.

The geography of consumers of Turkmen polypropylene is quite extended: Japan, Russia, Turkey, Iran, Uzbekistan, Azerbaijan and other neighbouring and remote countries. A major amount of this export product is delivered by sea that required construction of a warehouse for keeping and loading export products which are in great demand on the world markets. The fully automated warehouse with the storage capacity of 90,000 tons of polypropylene a year occupies the total area of 12,000 square metres. Every day Komatsu loaders (Japan) and other equipment produced by the leading manufacturers handle hundreds of tons of environmentally friendly polymer transported there from the storehouses of Turkmenbashi oil refineries.

During these days Turkmen polypropylene is being loaded on the Russian vessel Efe at the Turkmenbashi seaport. The dry cargo ship will deliver 1,000 tons of polypropylene packed in sacks to Astrakhan. This year it is the sixth foreign vessel loaded with Turkmen polypropylene. In spring when the navigation period among the river and sea ports on the Caspian Sea and Volga, the Sea of Azov, the Baltic Sea will be opened, traffic intensity will increase considerably. In this period dozens of thousands of tons of cargo delivered to and outside the country via the Caspian Sea are handled on the berths of the Turkmen seaport are handled every month.

Along with loading sea vessels the terminal serves the long caravans of heavy dumpers, which come for Turkmen polypropylene from Turkey. The terminal loaded 250 trailers and 95 railway cars for the past two months. Quite often the production with the logo of the Turkmenbashi oil refineries are loaded from port trailers to the trucks of foreign carrier agencies, sea vessels and railway cars passing the port warehouses.

As is known, the priorities of the strategy for developing petrochemical industry in the epoch of new Revival includes construction of the facilities producing polypropylene and the enterprises manufacturing various goods from it for the domestic and foreign consumer markets. This large-scale activity was launched after the millisecond catalytic cracking (MSCC) unit producing liquefied gas that is used to manufacture polypropylene had been put into operation at the Turkmenbashi oil refineries. The first polypropylene unit with the capacity of 90,000 tons a year was built there. This project funded by the Eksimbank (Japan) was implemented by the consortium of the Japanese companies - JGC, Itochu, Nissho Iwai, Marubeni. Thus, this event transformed the Turkmenbashi complex of oil refineries from a petroleum refining facility into a petrochemical plant.

Telecommunication technologies serve petrochemical workers

The project on full automation of the product transport and delivery processes is under completion at the Turkmenbashi complex of oil refineries - the leading petrochemical enterprise of the country. It was made possible through installing SCADA - the telecommunication supervisory control and data acquisition system at the Kenar enterprise for storing and loading oil products.

In accordance with the Resolution of the President of Turkmenistan the 33 million euro worth project is implemented jointly with the Oil and Gas Trading LTD Company (the British Virgin Islands) and the Turkish construction company Ekol. The SCADA system installed and being prepared for operation by the foreign partners at the request of the Turkmenbashi complex of oil refineries and the MOTOROLA wireless communication system enable to control all processes at the petroleum storage depot remotely.

The 80-km pipelines that supply diesel and heating oil, gasoline, kerosene and other oil products to the storage facilities and offshore terminal, where they are loaded in tankers, tank farm, distribution and oil loading units of the berths and railway platforms of the enterprise are equipped with precision instruments. The data collected by digital devices installed on the dispatch control units is processed by the computers of the operator and central control stations. Counting units were tested with the help of the FLOW PROVER test device.
